

Introduction of the story

In 2020, what do Hong Kong people remember? What is our Reality?

Introduction of the story

- ... Covid 19 lock down, crazy for toilet rolls, mask and sanitizer
- ... Fear of death, social distancing affects every aspect of lives
- ... Lennon wall, Pepe the Frog
- ... Protests, tear gas

Globalization brings advancement and convenience, yet, we are still vulnerable when we face all these issues. Technology could not bring us peace and strength; the power of nature is subdued during the course of cosmopolitanism.

In the time of social movements and coronavirus, Hong Kong city and its people are wounded and surrounded by over-whelmed information, what if Art could spare them a moment to identify what is real, and what do they really need?

Inspired by Olafur Eilasson. Olafur Eliasson is a Conceptual Danish-Icelandic artist with focus on global environment and nature. His belief and interpretation towards the environment awakens people's awareness of our planet, and his artworks unveil the beauty and impact of nature and trigger participants to re-think human relationship with it.

The reasons for the artist residency project

i. Significant Arts And Cultural Exchange

Olafur Eliasson's art spectrum spans from sculpture, painting, photography, film and installation, his focus on multi-sensorial perception with the usage of light, water and temperature provides alternative immersive participatory experience to local audiences. His large-scale site-specific installation offers another art & culture perspective to Hong Kong artists and the art scene. The residency project to trigger local artists and audiences to re-think contemporary art possibilities and the relationship between human and nature, arts and space.

Olafur Eliasson never visited Hong Kong and his last Asian exhibition was back in 2012 at Seoul. The residency project could initiate a new arts & cultural exchange between Asia and Europe, especially after COVID 19 which has stimulated many new perspectives and formats for arts expression and towards humanity.



ii. Healing Moment For The City And People

Hong Kong has been gone through a traumatic tough year; with over 6-month protests followed by COVID19, the whole city was in negative emotion. People are wounded with social conflicts and fear of death, and the lock down has intensified anxiety. A study from medical journal "The Lancent" mentioned Hong Kong people are suffering from "probable major depression" and it is 5 times high when compared to 2014, and almost 22% people suffering from PTSD. The whole city needs emotional regulation and shifts their focus from long-term political and socio-economic conflicts to other engagement.

The artist "Senses" & "Nature" focus offers a healing experience to participants, allows people to take a break from the over-whelmed information and news, stay away from your mobile and internet and focus on presence.

iii. Cultivate Dialogue Between Human And Nature

Hong Kong is a small city with 75% land left in a natural state, however, the overdeveloped 25% land earns the city "concrete jungle" name. And when compared to other developed cities, Hong Kong is relatively backward in environmental issues no matter from daily recycling behavior to global climate change topics; conveniences win over environmental responsibility. With Olafur Eliasson residency, we would like his Danish-Icelandic background and his Anthropocene concept on global environment offers a strong vision to motivate local people to re-think the interdependence roles between human and nature. Olafur installations are impactful projects to activate public awareness of social issues in an aesthetically powerful way, aiming to change human perception and attitude. His persistence of using art to awaken humans could set a new vision for locals.



Pre-research

i. Nature Environment Hong Kong VS Iceland



ii. Hong Kong Recent Situation

Hong Kong society experienced complicated and complex emotions throughout the year. Social movement began in June 2019 brings disappointment and rage but also solidarity and unity to residents living in Hong Kong, who are looking for a place to rethink and rediscover Hong Kong through a new lens and give themselves a break from the unbearable reality. COVID-19 comes after, recalling the experience of SARS in 2003, Hong Kong is surrounded by anxiety, residents are in a great fear despite being physically isolated from each other. Hong Kong has been through a traumatic tough year, people are wounded with social conflicts and fear of death, the lock down has intensified anxiety. A study from a medical journal mentioned almost 22% of people suffering from PTSD. The whole city needs emotional regulation and shifts their focus from long-term political and socio-economic issues to other engagement.




About the Artists

Olafur Eliasson & Kingsley Ng


Olafur Eliasson

There are three main criteria why we selected Olafur Eliasson to be our invited artist to Hong Kong. Eliasson has changed the meaning of an artist. His works across architecture, ecology, food, education, sustainability, climate change, perception and collective activity. It may sound unrealistic to many people, but his works always have a sense of wonder which also explains why they can speak to different people around the world.

First of all, He is interested in the connection between an experience that might take place in a gallery and the way it might affect the behaviour when the audience leave the gallery in relation to the world around them. The artist wanted viewers not just to have an experience, but conscious of having that experience. Viewers would be made self-aware by the set-up of his work, of that experience of looking.







Second, he strives to make the concerns of art relevant to society at large, policy marking and issues of sustainability and climate change.



He is also good at employing elemental natural materials such as light, water, air temperature, the uncontrollable, invisible but with huge possibility - weather, to enhance the viewer's experience.







Third, he is keen for his art to address climate change, like the Ice Watch artwork in 2014. He attempted to make this crisis of climate change tangible for people because it gives people a physical experience and puts people really in touch with something that usually we could not imagine in daily life. Algae Window in 2020 - Leverage the concept of diatoms which remove huge amounts of carbon from the atmosphere to create the artwork, to create the artwork.





Eliasson's artworks range from sculpture, painting, photography, and installation in the public sphere. His installation artworks create an immersive environment and would be provocative and sensuous in the city called Hong Kong - which is known as a high-density city with a fast-paced lifestyle.

Kingsley Ng


Kingsley Ng is an interdisciplinary artist, focusing on conceptual, site-specific, and community-engaging projects. Kingsley worked with the Drainage Services Department to create an installation artwork - After The Deluge in 2018, which is the reflection of human response to nature in extreme weather and the impact of climate change, as well as the appreciation of the unknown heroes in our society.



He believes that art helps us to mediate our environment, whether as a viewer or as a participant. Like the grazing of the wind against grass, art is also about experience as well as about emotions.




Art is related to society and serves as a medium to reflect the social issues. Kingsley's project, Twenty-Five Minutes Older in 2017, turned the territory's iconic transport - Tram, into a mobile artwork, which mediated the passengers to feel and experience "Hong Kong" in another way.







The collaboration between the 2 artists is not just a dialogue between Asian & European world with focus on multi-sensory installation, this is the reflection of views & values towards the planet and the reality. The artworks to be the first step to trigger participants to re-think human relationship with nature.




The Project

What Is The Reality?

i. Theme of the project

Can we choose our "reality"? Talking about reality, it always sounds like a circumstance forcing people to face. Especially in a hard time like now, Hong Kong has experienced a long period of social movements and followed by a global pandemic of coronavirus. Is it possible for us to re-create another "reality" other than the one we are situated in? We believe art may help in constructing an alternative reality, which allows people to take a break from the current situation and ultimately achieve the function of healing. Hence, we set the title of this project as a question, "What is the reality?", to encourage the audience to imagine various possibilities.




i. Benefit from this project

Learning from the previous works of Olafur Eliasson and Kingsley Ng, they have rich experience working on site-specific and immersive installations. A dreamy atmosphere is commonly found in their works.

Putting the two artists together, we believe some chemical reactions could be achieved. Regarding their previous works, they should be able to construct a space completely breaking away from the "reality" of the urban cityscape and tough time in Hong Kong. Besides that, audiences may see the city from a different lens and re-discover our surroundings, hence to recall their appreciation of this city.

Apart from the audiences, the artists may also be benefited from the cultural and artistic dialogue. Coming from Northern Europe, Olafur Eliasson would have a chance to stay in an Asian coastal city, where weather and vegetation are very different from his origin. Traveling to a completely different place enables him to get new inspiration. The art practice between the two artists are similar, but not the same. Their form is close, but their perspective is a bit different. Olafur Eliasson concerns more about the environment, while Kingsley Ng used to develop his project from a historical point of view. Working on the same subject with different perspectives, the two artists would have the chance to explore the city and understand each other's artistic approach. Therefore, this crossover is not only an intercultural experience, but also enables artistic exchanges.



Curatorial Concept

To set the framework of this exhibition, we refer to a recent project by Kingsley Ng in 2018, "Secret Garden", which he had created an experiential artistic journey in a historical building, Hong Kong Visual Arts Centre (HKVAC). The artist researched the history of the building and presented the old story by adding installations to the site. Audiences came and explored the "Secret Garden, not only enjoyed an art experience, but also had a chance to re-discover the unheard history of the city.

Borrowing this concept to our project, we set the exhibition venue at Asia Society Hong Kong Centre (ASHK), which is also a historical site consisting of both indoor and outdoor areas. This site is the former Explosives Magazine of the old Victoria Barracks, which the Former Magazine A (now named as Chantal Miller Gallery) would be our main exhibition space and its surrounding outdoor areas will be reserved for the showcase. Noted that, the ASHK is located in Admiralty, which is right in the centre of the city. The Centre is a bit up in the hill and adjacent to Hong Kong Park. Inside the Centre, there is a garden with waterfalls, which gives a sense of tranquillity. Given the historical and environmental characteristics of the venue, we believe it provides a favorable starting point for Olafur Eliasson and Kingsley Ng to co-develop a series of site-specific works.

Olafur Eliasson has rich experience in recreating naturalistic phenomena inside a gallery. Take the Weather Project (2003) as an example, the artist tries to mimic the extreme climate situation in the Turbine Hall of Tate Modern. Audiences could experience the heat and haze of the sun in an indoor space. This approach may have special meaning now, as it somehow echoes with the experience of lockdown during the coronavirus pandemic. People are longing for a walk outside, but are forced to stay away from nature. How would it be possible to borrow nature to your home? Nothing is impossible as Olafur Eliasson has demonstrated in his previous works. Therefore, we would like to invite the artist to come and experience the natural environment of Hong Kong and create a tailor-made immersive installation in ASHK.

Besides installation, we would like to invite Kingsley Ng to develop a soundwalk journey. He is familiar with handling historical narrative and translating them into multi-media art experiences. Take the After the Deluge (2018) as an example, he transformed the history of Tai Hang Tung Storage Tank into an audio-visual immersive art piece. Asia Society Hong Kong Centre, the venue of our exhibition, is also rich in history. Kingsley Ng is invited to dig into the past of the site and develop an audio tour with the support of installations. These artistic interventions are expected to be subtle and minimal, as long as it could trigger an alternative visiting experience, which demonstrates how art is possible in recreating reality.

By mixing 6 past artworks plus 4 new collaborative artwork. We are looking forward to seeing the modernization of nature. Based on the previous works of the two artists as discussed above, we would assign Olafur Eliasson to work inside the gallery, while Kingsley Ng is encouraged to focus more on the outdoor area. Kingsley continues his historical approach, while Olafur Eliasson carries on his environment exploration.

In many people's perceptions, both tourists and some city dwellers, Hong Kong is a concrete jungle and modern city. In fact, only 25% of the land area of this city has been developed. The remaining majority is countryside. Besides nature, there are many historical sites preserved, ranging from walled villages to colonial architectures. These are also important parts of Hong Kong, but always neglected by the mainstream discourse. In our exhibition, we would like to invite Olafur Eliasson and Kingsley, two artists with different backgrounds, to work together on celebrating the history and nature of Hong Kong, urging the public to recall the forgotten beauty of Hong Kong.

Selected Artwork

In order to show the coherence of the artwork and the topic What Is The Reality? We planned to use The Yellow Room and the After the deluge as a base. By mixing this past artwork plus the new creation, we hope to tell the story with the past, present and future.









Practical information

i. Venue

The exhibition will be held at Chantal Miller Gallery of Asia society Hong Kong (ASHK). ASHK was founded in 1990 by a group of local Hong Kong business leaders. The new center opened in 2011. It is an educational organization dedicated to fostering understanding of the countries and cultures of Asia, illuminating global issues that affect all regions.

Chantal Miller Gallery built between 1863 and 1868, is the oldest building in the Former Explosives Magazine, it has been restored as a modern exhibition space of international museum standard. Equipped with modernized exhibition lightings, audio-visual system, multimedia projectors and projection screen.



Reason

The reason for choosing ASHK as it is an architecture combining Chinese and Western style, that coordinates the concept of our project, fusion and cultural exchange. And it was designed as a concord of old and new, the historical background reflects the history of Hong Kong. Moreover, it is expected that the exhibits will use indoor and outdoor venues, ASHK is an ideal choice to provide open space for the two artists to arrange their works. Follow the exterior staircase of the gallery to the stunning garden, where visitors can enjoy the contrasting scenes of lush green foliage and the urban jungle of Admiralty. Overall, it is a place for quiet contemplation and an outdoor venue with dramatic views.






